


Cohousing

Cohousing is an **intentional community** of private homes typically clustered around shared space. Each attached or single family home has traditional components, including a private kitchen. Shared spaces typically feature a common house, which may include a large kitchen and dining area, laundry, and recreational spaces. Shared outdoor space may include parking, walkways, open space, and gardens. Neighbors also **share** resources like tools and lawnmowers.

Households have **independent** incomes and private lives, but neighbors collaboratively plan and manage community activities and shared spaces. The legal structure is typically an HOA, Condo Association, or Housing Cooperative. Community activities feature regularly-scheduled shared meals, meetings, and workdays. Neighbors gather for **parties**, games, movies, or other events. Cohousing makes it **easy** to form clubs, organize child and elder care, and carpool.

It's the art of sharing resources to make life more enjoyable and more affordable.

Common Coho Characteristics

Relationships

- Neighbors commit to being part of a community for everyone's mutual benefit.
- Cohousing cultivates a culture of sharing and caring.
- Design features and neighborhood size (typically 20-40 homes) promote frequent interaction and close relationships.

Balancing Privacy and Community

- Cohousing neighborhoods are designed for privacy as well as community.
- Residents balance privacy and community by choosing their own level of engagement.

Participation

- Decision making is participatory and often based on consensus or sociocracy.
- Self-management empowers residents, builds community, and saves money.

Shared Values

- Cohousing communities support residents in actualizing shared values.
- Cohousing communities typically adopt green approaches to living.

But What Is It Really?

Private Homes + Rich Common Amenities

- Everyone has their own fully functional home, usually as a condo legal entity.
- Sizes range from 500 sf 1800 sf, Heartwood homes range from 700 sf to 1400 sf.
- Common House with dining, kitchen, living, guest rooms, laundry, and spaces that vary more by community such as exercise, crafts, studio space, yoga, or mediation.
- Site amenities often include workshop, greenhouse, community garden, hot tub, dog park, fire pit, play spaces.

Self Determination, Personal Growth, Connection

- Team structure, satisfying and mutually supportive dynamic.
- Long term "skin in the game" relationships
- Mutual Support


