

How


- Empower small groups

Empower small groups

= avoid large groups


- Option 1: Full-on structure of distributed authority.
- Option 2:
 Partially distributed authority.
 (= Give a clearly defined area of authority to a team and let them run with it)







Create clarity: agenda planning

Consent decision making



Consent process

(small groups!)

- clear, structured
- inclusive
- pragmatic

understand

explore

decide

Make sure everyone understands the proposal.

(present and Qs)

Give everyone a chance to respond to the proposal.


(reaction round)

Make sure there are no objections.

(consent round)
