


- pet population at Casa Verde

- cats generally not a problem


Pet population at CVCA





Concerns


- not everyone has a fenced in yard
- no special pet exercise area
- owners not picking up
- negative pet behavior:
 e.g. aggression, barking



Our approach

- PORT: Pet Ownership Responsibility Team (elected position)
- Pet policy: revised as needed; condensed at community meetings





Casa Verde Commons - a co-housing community

Rules

- abide by city ordinances
- clean up after pet
- notes in Common House
- owners responsible for noisy or aggressive dogs
- play on turf; repair damage

- cats can roam, but clean up after them
- visitors must abide
- dogs unleash or under voice control and within eyesight of owner at all times
- introduce new pets to community
- if in violation, respond appropriately

It's a slow proc but she's doing really well with it. She's a very sensitive dog, and I'm working clo with her trainers at House of Dog to apply this method that focuses on positive reinforcement.

My other dog, Simon (small, black, and gray) is partially blind, has trouble hearing is old, so we just let him have bad manners and do whatever he wants.

Violations

- Barking / excessive noise
- Dangerous dogs (as defined by the state)
- Negative dog/pet behavior(as defined by the state)
- Defecation not cleaned up
- Pet not within eyesight of owner

If negative /dangerous dog behavior is identified, owners must:

- Ist offense: Dog and owner must work with a Behavior Modification Trainer, at owner's expense, within 30 days; dog must be leashed at all times
- 2nd offense: if within 3 months, dog must be muzzled at all times
- 3rd offense: if within 6 months, not allowed in shared areas, must be leashed and muzzled when leaving the property
- 4th offense: if within 1 year, dog must be removed from the property

Failure to comply

 A fine \$25 per day will be imposed if the dog owner fails to take the above actions
